Have you heard the term, "It is **not what you know** but **what you do** with what you know?" For the Christian, you and I have the responsibility to make sure that our faith is not academic but practical. We study in Bible classes, attend worship services, and join in conferences or seminars for years with the expectation that our time is well spent. When our hours merely reflect facts and history, without us knowing how to apply Christ's love and burden for the lost, we have wasted our efforts. Many a so-called Christian has learned how to memorize Scripture but remains insensitive to the way his/her daily testimony impacts others. Our control over our own behavior and awareness of the needs of others must motivate our lives beyond what we have gained in knowledge.

Some of you have heard the term "知易行難" (To Know is Easy & To Do is Hard). Sometimes these two terms are reversed but, for our purposes today, the emphasis is to say that without the grasp of Christ's burden and sacrifice of His life, we are just "going through the motions" of being a Christian. It is through our care and burden for leading others to know and grow with Christ that true evidence of our interpersonal relationship with Jesus is revealed. We must learn all we can but we must also allow Jesus' values to become ours!

Judging the actions or mistakes of others is easy. Yet, the Scripture reminds us clearly that none of us is without our own share of mistakes and sin. Before we see it as our responsibility to use the Scripture to catch the struggles of others, perhaps we need to reflect on our own limitations for living as Christ would have us function? I don't know about you but I certainly look in my "spiritual mirror" most days and am not as impressed I would like to be! I'll make a deal with you, I'll remember you for prayer even as I request your mutual prayers!

You, however, are not in the realm of the fleshy but are in the realm of the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God lives in you. And if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, they do not belong to Christ.
