What is Ordination? Ordination is the "setting aside of a person for a specific ministry role" within a church. Some would say that it is a symbol of a person moving from the role of laity to clergy due to that individual's commitment to full-time ministry. Ordination is usually done for a minister or a deacon as their church "calls them out" for their willingness to serve Christ's church. Today, I want to specifically address the Ordination of a Pastor to the title of Reverend. No, it doesn't mean that he instantly becomes a sinless individual but it does mean that this person is trusted by his church to serve Christ with a serious commitment and love. It is a one-time service where other ministers or deacons, who have been ordained in their own right, take the opportunity to lay hands on an individual and pray for his future ministry service. The goal is to have the church, via the deacons and other ministers, bless the new minister by offering unified prayer in asking God's care for this newly ordained ministry servant. Ordination doesn't require specific elements in the service but is merely an action of support and blessing.
