Pastor's Word:

The SBC Cooperative Program is "our Heartbeat!"

Begun in 1925 (almost 100 years ago), the burden of our **Cooperative Program** has been evangelistic mission work. SBC churches "pool their personnel and financial resources" with the goal of having every person in our world have the opportunity to know Christ as their personal Savior and Lord. With over 6,500 missionaries serving between the International Mission Board and the North American Mission Board, finances for these personnel and their ministries require much from our churches but our values for the salvation of our world call for our support. We are a team of nearly 50,000 churches nationally as we do international and domestic mission work, social service work, provide over 40 Baptist university options, provide Christian education for pastors and other ministers in 6 National Baptist seminaries with over 15,000 students at present, have children's ministries and orphan outreach, provide multiple Baptist camps, etc. State groupings (Conventions) cooperate with evangelism programs, children's homes, volunteer ministries and social service outreaches, the starting of new churches, collegiate ministries, camps, etc.

Just as churches encourage members to give their 10% tithe for the individual church's ministries, the churches then determine how to use these resources and funds for both local, statewide, national, and international ministries by giving to the SBC Cooperative Program. These pooled funds are the tools of various Baptist committees and institutions that represent us in doing educational, outreach, and broad ministry services. Our church is not alone!

The Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission is dedicated to addressing social, moral, and ethical concerns, with particular attention to their impact on American families and their faith. They also provide print resources that offer scriptural responses to the moral and ethical problems of our culture. With the moral and ethical realities of our world today, this organization is vital to remind us to remain vigilant in our Christian values and direction.

This is our SBC Cooperation Program and why we are impacting our world together.
