WORDS: "Michael Santos is Gone"

In the summer of 2013, my wife and I departed Shanghai to return to life in the western world. After several months in the US, January 1 of 2014 was our first day of ministry at Vancouver Chinese Baptist Church. During the first two weeks there, I received news that Michael Santos, my coworker and friend, had died at the age of 52 in his home in Manila. His death left his wife and 3 small children on their own. Michael was born in Maryland and completed his Bachelors and MBA before becoming an international businessman with an educational corporation in China.

Michael always appeared healthy and energetic so his passing with a heart attack was a shock. When any of us have lived for a few years, we have had the experience of losing a relative or friend that we had not expected to see depart at the time that they did. When a friend/relative is elderly, the idea of that person passing from the trials and health issues of this world is seen as understandable. For younger persons, the hope is for a productive and meaningful life experience.

Honestly, even with many death experiences over the years, Michael's death was pretty devasting for me. I can say it shook my world. He had been trying to get me to come back to work with students in Asia and then, he was gone. The hole that he left was large for many of us. My point is that none of us know how long we have in this world regardless of our age or health. With only one life to offer our Lord, I can only hope that all of us at FCBC will see the urgency of giving our all to reaching the lost persons that surround us daily. Missions isn't just overseas work but is found in our own city. Let us be good soldiers for our Lord's service.
